

Plantation House Lantern, City of London



One of two lanterns that graced the entrance to the historic Plantation House, City of London. Six-sided, iron framed structure to lantern, with decorative zinc mouldings.

Plantation House, located on Fenchurch Street, City of London, was originally built in 1935, and served the commodities market, especially tea and rubber. It was once the world's recognised centre of the tea trade. The London Tea Auction resumed here after tea rationing ended in 1952, until they moved operations in 1971. It was also the home of the London Metal Exchange until 1994. Plantation House has now been demolished and is replaced with a modern development called Plantation Place.
